



SOUTH CENTRAL AMBULANCE SERVICE on tour



South Central Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust (SCAS) provides a range of emergency, urgent care, and non-emergency healthcare services to the populations of the south central region of the UK.

SCAS is a monopoly provider of 999 emergency ambulance services and serves a population of over seven million people

across six counties. SCAS employ over 4,000 staff who, together with over 1,200 volunteers, enable the trust to operate 24-hours a day, seven days a week, making recruitment a key priority for the service.

SCAS visited 10 sites across the area to promote recruitment and advertise vacancies at the trust. Governors and staff were able to raise awareness of the role of the ambulance service and engage with the public to gather feedback on what's working and what needs improvement. A local governor attended each location equipped with resources, ready to engage with their members and the wider public.

These events acted as a one-stop shop for those looking to join the emergency services by providing an opportunity to network with frontline staff and recruitment specialists on hand to share real-life experiences and explain the wide scope of roles available at the trust and the various entry routes.

The feedback from governors, public and staff has been positive, as we endeavour to bring both engagement and opportunities to our local communities, where it matters most.
