INTEGRATED LEADERSHIP TOOL (ILT) workshop



What we offer

This half day workshop is delivered on site and enables local health, care and wellbeing system leaders to identify their shared vision, commitment, leadership and accountability to achieve a fully integrated local health and care system.

The workshop, facilitated by senior figures in health, local government and social care, will enable you to identify where you are now and what more you need to do to escalate the scale and pace of system working and integration.

Our framework document and approach can be adapted to work across a range of complex situations, including diverse organisational structures or multiple planning and commissioning footprints.

The workshop includes:

- highly skilled and experienced facilitators with credibility in health, local government and adult social care
- pre-event scoping calls with key leaders to get a sense of the core issues and tailor the session to your local needs
- an active, focused self-assessment process to prompt group discussion
- agreed locally owned action points that can be developed into an action plan
- follow up discussion to identify what further action and support is needed.

What we need from you:

- commitment from the health and wellbeing board or STP/ICS
- system partners and other colleagues to own, attend and participate
- responsibility for arranging the workshop
- support the event on the day
- arrange up to four scoping calls with key leaders beforehand
- commitment to own and take forward action planning
- engage in a follow up call.

This workshop is best used when a group or system leadership team needs to improve the way it communicates, and considers its priorities.

What we offer

We have developed a mirroring offer for local NHS and political leaders to further mutual understanding and effective engagement as place based leaders in care, health and wellbeing.

This workshop explores organisational differences, looking at how NHS leaders can work more effectively with local government by understanding how local authorities work. It is aimed at local leaders from within NHS providers, clinical commissioning groups (CCGs), sustainability and transformation partnerships (STPs), integrated care systems (ICSs) and other local partnerships.

This half-day practical and interactive workshop will explore what local councillors do, their motivation, drivers and demands, the roles and responsibilities of members and officers, the culture of accountability and the benefits when local government and the NHS work together.

Our facilitators are experienced local politicians who will tailor the session to reflect the place based context and needs of the audience.

By the end of the session participants will:

- understand the structure of local government and its role in delivering wider public services
- gauge a politician's perspective of the environment in which they operate and how this influences local policy and decision making
- consider the implications of these for fostering effective working relationships with local government leaders
- discover how to influence this in the future.

This workshop is best used when health colleagues would benefit from understanding the culture, values and structures that make local government work.

What we offer

The offer for political leaders

This half day practical and interactive workshop will explore what local NHS leaders do, what motivates them, drivers and demands, the roles and responsibilities, the culture of accountability, and what happens when local government and the NHS work together.

It is aimed at local political leaders, local authorities, combined authorities, health and wellbeing boards, local government colleagues involved in sustainability and transformation partnerships (STPs), integrated care systems (ICSs) and other local partnerships.

Our facilitators are experienced local NHS leaders who will tailor the session to reflect the place based context and needs of the audience.

We will explore the context that NHS leaders work in, drivers and demands, roles and responsibilities, culture of accountability and what happens when local government and the NHS come together.

By the end of the session participants will:

- be aware of the structure of the NHS and its wider context
- have the opportunity to gauge an NHS leader's perspective of the environment in which they operate and how this influences policy and decision making nationally and locally
- consider the implications of these for fostering effective working relationships with NHS leaders.

This workshop is best used when local government colleagues would benefit from understanding the culture, values and structures that make the health service work.
